to welcome Kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2020, turning 5 in 2025. These children will begin Kindergarten in September 2025.

Online registration opened on November 1, 2024. Please visit our website https://sd38.bc.ca/student-registration/kindergarten-registration for more information about our online registration process, required documents, important dates, and FAQs.

We encourage families to complete their registration within the Priority 1 registration window, which spans from November 1, 2024 to January 17, 2025, to maximize their chances of securing a spot at their catchment school. All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 7, 2025.

 - o Student first name, with relationship (eg. "Rosie and Auntie")
 - o Division#
 - o Primary (K-3): Why you like this book and why you like reading with this person. (Eg "I like this book because _____")
 - o Intermediate (4-7): One sentence summary of what the book is about, and one more sentence of who should read this book (Eg. "This book is about a boy who misses his old home until he finds out he can time travel by entering apartment 713. You should read this book if you have ever moved and missed your old home.")

Two winners will be selected: one from Divisions 1-4, and one from Divisions 5-9. Winners must meet all the criteria listed above, and will win a new book to keep!

All submissions must be emailed to <u>grauer.library@sd38.bc.ca</u> by midnight on January 31, 2025. Draw will take place on February 4. Winners will be informed by their classroom teacher and the winner's guardians will be contacted by email.
